Dear Madam:-

I herewith enclose you processes in the suit instituted in your name as Guardian of your three infant children, and I at last gotten Mr J. Powell Royall to agree to join me, in regard to his ward Harriet Rachel Kelley, in order to save some costs.

In order to have the Court pass on the question of confirming the sale of the three infants, it is absolutely necessary for all of your children to accept service of the process, for the reason that in case one or all of the three infants were to die, all the other brothers and sisters would inherit the land. This is the law and we must comply with it.

I remember that you said that you could get all your children to accept service, and I have written the acceptance on each of the summons, and two or more can accept on the same paper, in fact all of them could do so, and I will thank you to send them to your children, and ask them to accept by writing their names, and return them to me or to the Clerk, at Tazewell, Va. and I hope that you can get them all to accept, and get the papers back here before Monday the 6th.

If you will get all these people to accept service, I can get the case completed this term of the Court.

I have also prepared notice to take depositions, which must also be accepted, and returned.

I will also have to have a copy of your qualification as Guardian.
