

June 26<sup>th</sup> 1879.

My dear husband.

I write you this morning to let you know that Pa is a little better. I stopped at Liza's and visited ~~at~~ one day and night - and the people do not think there is any danger in me going to see Pa. I will try to go home with the mail Thursday if Pa is still better. Don't be uneasy I will not expose myself at all. Dr. Floyd stays with Pa all the time and gives all the medicine. I hope Pa will get up though they say he is so weak and is getting weaker every day. Give my love to mother and Papa. Please don't be uneasy about me.
