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## METHOD OF GRADING AND STANDARD FOR CREDITS

Average daily grades count two-thirds and tests one-third for periodic grades. If no test is given, average of daily grades is grade for period. Average periodic grades count two-thirds and examination grades one-third for semester grade. Grades are to be in letters. A final grade of at least D is required for credit. Quality credits are: D, or 75 to 80—0; C, or 81 to 87—1; B, or 88 to 94—2; A, or 95 to 100—3. Pupils will be classified according to the following minimum credits: Second year—3 quantity and 3 quality; third year—7 quantity and 7 quality; fourth year—12 quantity and 12 quality; graduation—16 quantity and 16 quality, and an aggregate grade of at least C on Citizenship.
