
Welcome, New Resident ~

Graham, Jr., was born and grew up in Purcellville, Va., attended college and medical school in Richmond, Va., and spent his career practicing in Virginia. A true Virginian through-and-through! Thomas Jefferson, himself, would have been happy to call him friend.

After graduating from Lincoln High School in Lincoln, Va., Charlie attended the University of Richmond for his pre-med studies. From there, he went a short distance to the Medical College of Virginia where he received an MD, did his internship, and completed his residency in 1963. In 1963 and 1964, he was a full-time instructor in OB-GYN at the Medical College. Deciding to go into private practice, he settled in Radford, Va., for the next 35 years. This tenure was interrupted for two years when he joined the U.S. Army Medical Corps as Chief of Obstetrics-Gynecology at Lyster Army Hospital in Fort Rucker, Ala.
