COURSE DESCRIPTION: Psy 201 is designed to familiarize students with the basic concepts, principles, and perspectives of the discipline of psychology. Three major points of view will be emphasized: experimental psychology, clinical psychology, and social psychology. Based on reading material from the text, the following assignments reflect this emphasis.

GRADES: Test I and Test II will each constitute 25% of the student's grade and will be worth 100 points each. The final examination will constitute 50% of the student's grade and will be worth 200 points. Students are also required to participate as subjects for at least 4 hrs. in various psychological research projects (or in prescribed alternative equivalent experience). After the four hour requirement has been fulfilled, you will be rewarded with 5 additional points for each one-hour in which you participate as a subject. When you agree to participate as a subject and do not show up at the designated time, you lose 5 points. Be sure to get your time straight.

Final grades will be determined on the basis of the total number of points scored (e.g., A = 360 to 400, B = 320 to 359, C = 280 to 319, D = 240 to 279, and E = below 240). NO INCOMPLETES will be given.

RULE: Attendance on the test dates is mandatory. No make-up tests will be given and your score for a missed exam will be 10 points lower than the lowest score made by one of your classmates from the class. If you have sufficient reason for missing an exam (e.g., a doctor's excuse) you must have your absence approved by your lecturers before the test is given.
