This Deed made this 29th day of April
1891 between J. B. McCabe Special Commissioner as herein-after
set forth party of the first part and John Arnold of the County of
Loudon State of Virginia party of the second part: Whereas by a
Decree of the Circuit Court of Loudon County entered at the Octo-Term
1890 in the Chancery cause entitled Lakin vs Jones. Therein
depending, it was among other things adjudged, ordered and decreed
that E. Nichols and J. B. McCabe, who were thereby appointed
Special Commissioners for the purpose, should sell by public Auction
after certain advertisement and upon certain terms in the said
decree fully set forth, certain real estate therein described: and
Whereas the said E. Nichols and J. B. McCabe pursuant to the said
decree, did, on the 9th day of March 1891 after having duly
advertised the same in accordance with the terms of said decree
offer for sale by public Auction the following described real estate
to wit, the farm of which Leman T. Jones died seized and
possessed, situated in Loudon County - Virginia, and by the
survey of W. T. Brown filed in the papers of said cause bounded
and described as follows: Beginning in the Public Road leading
from Waterford to the Pt. of Rocks at a planted stone designated
on plat - as A. 15-foot west of Giddings fence and corner to
Mr. James' deed, then with a line of the latter S 75° W 26.63 chs.
to B. a stone in James' line, then with James and Russell
N 20 5/8° W 59.60 chs. to C. on north-west back of Creek (Calvert)

then with - T. Ernhart N 78 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° E. 16, 10 chs. to W. a stake, then with same S 63 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E 43, 96 chs. to E. a flat stone in corner of a field on west side of Pt of Rocks road & a corner with W. McCabe Special Commissioner as forward doth grant unto the said John Arnold with special warranty the real estate hereinbefore fully described
