This Indenture made the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August in  
the year eighteen hundred and thirty two Between William  
M. Carthy and Emily his wife of the County of Fairfax  
and State of Virginia of the one part and Simon Yeakley  
of the County of Loudoun and said State of the other  
part Witnesses that the said William M. Carthy & Emily his  
wife in consideration of One Dollar of lawful money of the  
Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Simon  
Yeakley at or before the executing and delivery of these presents  
(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and  
sold and by these presents do bargain & sell unto the said  
Simon Yeakley his heirs and assigns a certain tract of Land  
lying and being in the County of Loudoun in what is called  
The Guernon Settlement bounded as is specified and described in  
a certain deed from George M. Chichester Esq. to the said  
William M. Carthy and bearing date on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April in the

year 1827 and recorded in the Clerk's Office of Sevier County and bounded also in part by a certain other deed for twenty odd Acs of Land from the said William M. M. Carty and wife to the said Yeater it being a part of that original tract conveyed to the said M. Carty by the said Christopher Yeater in the deed aforesaid; But the land conveyed & now intended to be conveyed by this Indenture is supposed to be about one hundred and forty Acs and is all the residue of the aforesaid tract conveyed as aforesaid by the said Christopher Yeater to the said M. Carty after deducting the aforesaid twenty odd Acs conveyed to the said Yeater in the year 1827 or the year 1828 by the said M. Carty & wife and the deed conveying the said twenty odd Acs was executed & acknowledged by the said M. Carty & wife in the Territory of Florida but it has not been recorded by the said Yeater. Part of the said deed for the said twenty odd Acs from the said M. Carty to said Yeater has been lost by the said Yeater, then the land hereby conveyed and intended to be hereby conveyed by this Indenture is the whole and entire tract conveyed as aforesaid by the said Christopher Yeater to said M. Carty in the aforesaid deed dated the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1827 and bounded as therein specified & described and is supposed to contain one hundred and sixty six Acs two Rods and twenty two poles be the same more or less together with all and singular the appurtenances and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders yearly and other rents issues and profits thereof To have and to hold the said tract of Land according to the terms of this Indenture with the tenements hereditaments and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned or intended to be bargained and sold and every part and parcel thereof with every of their rights members and appurtenances unto the said Simon Yeater his heirs and assigns forever. And the said William M. M. Carty and Emily his wife for themselves and their heirs the said tract of Land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Simon Yeater his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said William M. M. Carty and Emily his wife or either of them and their neither of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall well and do warrant and favour defend by these presents.
