

J. Derry Tribby, banker, Loudoun native

J. Derry Tribby, 80, a retired banker and native of Loudoun, died Aug. 25 at his home in Augusta, Ga., where he had resided for the past four years.

Born near Hillsboro, he was a son of Jessie W. and Martha D. Tribby.

Mr. Tribby graduated from the old Lincoln High School and attended several banking schools.

He was associated with the First Virginia Bank at Purcellville for 45 years, retiring in 1971 as vice president and cashier of the bank.

Mr. Tribby served as mayor of Purcellville from 1962 to 1971 and prior to that, from 1957 to 1961, as a member of town council.

After retiring from the bank he engaged in tax work for several years prior to moving to Augusta,

where he and his wife lived near a son and his family.

As a member of Bethany United Methodist Church, Mr. Tribby was actively involved in church affairs and served many years as treasurer and as a member of the board of trustees.

Surviving are his wife Margaret Graham Tribby of the home; two sons, Dr. William L. (Bill) Tribby of Winston-Salem, N.C., and Dr. David C. Tribby of Augusta; and six grandchildren.

Graveside services will be held at the Hillsboro Cemetery Thursday, Aug. 28 at 3 p.m. conducted by the Rev. William B. Ramey.
