Laffer, 76, a microbiologist who had been a professor and associate dean at the University of Maryland and a past national president of the American Society of Professional Biologists, died of a heart ailment Jan. 21 at the Washington Hospital Center.

He joined the faculty at College Park in 1946 as an associate professor of bacteriology, then served as assistant dean of the college of arts and sciences for 8 years, before returning to teaching in 1972. He retired in 1978 as a professor in the university's microbiology department. After that, he was a docent at the National Portrait Gallery.

He was a member of University United Methodist Church in College Park and the American Academy of

Microbiologists.

Dr. Laffer, who lived in College Park, was a native of Meadville, Pa., and was a graduate of Allegheny College. He earned a master's degree at the University of Maine and his doctorate in microbiology at the University of Illinois. He served in the Army during World War II, attaining the rank of major.
