Martin Yakey's Funeral Is in Church Saturday

Thomas Martin Yakey, 67, long time Purcellville resident, died early today (Thursday) in his home after illness of several months.

Mr. Yakey, son of the late Thomas and Eliza James Yakey, was born and reared in the Lovettsville section of Loudoun. He moved to Purcellville about 37 year ago. After his marriage to the former Hazel Frame, he established his residence there. Mr. Yakey had more recently been employed by the firm of Kemp's Home and Farm Supply in Purcellville.

Mr. Yakey was a member of Purcellville Baptist Church and for a number of years had been

a member of the church choir. Also he had held membership in the Purcellville Lions Club. During his long residence in the county he had made many friends.

Besides his wife, Mrs. Hazel Frame Yakey, he is survived by three daughters, Mrs. Henry Erbe, Mrs. Charlie Davis and Mrs. Thomas O. Kelley, all of Arlington and five grandchildren. Also he leaves one brother, M. Henry Yakey, Taylorstown and two sisters, Mrs. Bonnie Arnold and Mrs. Edith Bruin, Lovettsville.

Funeral services will be held from the Purcellville Baptist Church on Saturday at 2 o'clock, conducted by his pastor, the Rev. E. T. Clark, Jr. Burial will be made in Hillsboro Cemetery.
