W.R. GRAHAM EXPIRES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

It is with profound regret that we chronicle the death of Mr. William R. Graham, which occurred at his home, about a mile east of this town, at 1 o'clock January 28th. He had been in declining health for some time, and having consulted well known specialists without finding relief, he, at the advice of his family physician Dr. Clagett, went to Garfield Hospital in Washington, where an operation was performed on him on the 21st of last April for cancer of the stomach. The disease had made such ravages that the surgeons could afford only a temporary betterment of his condition.

Mr. Graham was a native of Tazewell county and was in the 60th year of his age. On coming to Loudoun some 10 or 12 years ago he purchased the home farm of the late Chas. C. Mercier (one of the best in this section) upon which he had since resided. Later he purchased the Posey farm near Waterford, and was extensively engaged in stock raising and agricultural pursuits. He was a man of fine judgment, great energy and will power, and possessed a well cultivated mind that had been stored with a fund of practical information.

He was for a number of years a member of the Presbyterian Church, and also a member of Hamilton Lodge A. F. & A. M.

Before leaving Tazewell Mr Graham was for a term or more deputy clerk of the County Court.

He is survived by his wife and eight children - Charles, Samuel and Wade and Misses Mary, Annie, Ollie, Ossie and Margaret Lee Graham.

His funeral took place from his late home. Rev. J.M. Holiday assisted by Rev Mr. Fettsler officiating. The burial was in the family lot in Lakeview Cemetery, the ceremonies at the grave being conducted by Hamilton Lodge of Masons.
